I would probably use Wevideo in my classroom mostly because of the collaboration feature. Students can work on different portions instead of having just one student work on the video while everyone else watches. Wevideo also has the feature where you can choose the level of story board editing you want to use. The basic form is simple with video and automatically adds transitions to your pictures and video. The advanced version looks more like iMovie, and students can edit music, transitions, and other effects. This feature allows students to select the level they feel comfortable with. Students can even change this setting after they start a video. While Stupeflix does have many of the same features as Wevideo and offers discounted plans for educators, it does not seem as user friendly.
